The Rochester Marriott Airport Hotel was completely renovated and refurbished in 2007; it is a very comfortable hotel, convenient to some of the best birding sites in the area, to a number of restaurants and (for non-birders) good shopping.

Directions to the hotel:

From the west: Take the NYS Thruway exit 47, I-490 to Rochester, to NY Route 390 North to the NY Route 104 West (Ridge Road West) exit. Follow the ramp right, onto Ridge Road heading west. The Airport Marriott Hotel will be on your right; take a right at the stop light just past the hotel, then a right into its driveway.

From the east: Take Thruway exit 46, I-390 North to Rochester; the road will divide, so follow the signs to the Greater Rochester International Airport. Continue on I-390 North past the airport and the I-490 junction to the NY Route 104 West (Ridge Road West) exit. Follow the ramp right, onto Ridge Road heading west. The Airport Marriott Hotel will be on your right; take a right at the stop light just past the hotel, then a right into its driveway.
